NYAC OLYMPICS NEWS

Water Polo - Nine NYAC Medals, All Gold

The US women's water polo team, with nine NYAC players on the roster, secured its third consecutive Olympic gold medal by effecting a 14-5 victory over Spain 14-5 this afternoon. The USA took the lead early on, with the NYAC's Alys Williams scoring with just 27 seconds gone in the match. Maggie Steffens, also NYAC, added another goal with 3:36 left in the quarter. Spain fired off six shots before scoring; but, Maddie Musselman and Rachel Fattal,



both NYAC, each scored in the last minute to give the USA a 4-1 advantage after one quarter. Spain rallied in the second quarter, but Musselman, Kaleigh Gilchrist (NYAC) and Makenzie Fischer a each scored to make the half-time score 7-4.



Five unanswered goals in the third quarter gave the USA an insurmountable margin, assisted by the remarkable goalkeeping of the NYAC's Ashleigh Johnson, who shut down the Spain offense with a series of stops in the second half. Spain scored just once in the second half. In total, nine players scored for Team USA, led by Musselman's three goals. Remarkably, with this win, the US team continues its string of claiming medals in every Olympic Games since women's water polo was added to the program in 2004.

Wrestling - Bronze for Hildebrandt

In the women's 50kg division, the NYAC;s Sarah Hildebrandt, who stepped down in weight to compete in Tokyo, today won the bronze medal by taking a 12-1 victory by technical superiority over Oksana Livach of Ukraine. Facing Oksana Livach from Ukraine, the 50kg bronze medalist from the 2018 World Championships and the 2019 European champion, the match was intense, though Hildebrandt's from the outset. The NYAC woman's bronze adds to the silver medal she took at 53kg in the 2018 World Championships.



Modern Pentathlon - Elgeziry 25th

The NYAC's Amro Elgeziry won the swimming competition in today's men's modern pentathlon. That was his best event, however; after the fencing, equestrian and laser run, he ultimately placed 25th with 1358 points, 124 behind the winner.
